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Purpose and Scope

This service bulletin describes how to convert from a *Matthews* V84i print controller to the new *Matthews MPERIA*[®] print controller for the *MiTek*[®] *BLADE*.

Overview

Printer Configurations

The *BLADE* wood processing system can be customized to use a number of different print configurations. When appropriate, the instructions in this document will account for different print configuration options using the A-F labels listed in Table 1. Note that this document only covers straight conversions from matching options (A to A, B to B, etc.)

Table 1: BLADE Print Head Configurations

Procedure

Electrical Lockout/Tagout Procedure

⚠ WARNING

ELECTROCUTION HAZARD.

All electrical work must be performed by a qualified electrician.

Verify that all power to the machine has been turned off and follow approved lockout/tagout safety procedures before performing any maintenance.

If it is absolutely necessary to troubleshoot an energized machine, follow NFPA 70E for proper procedures and person protective equipment.

Procedure for Working Either on a Machine Inside the Machine's Main Electrical Enclosure or in the Electrical Transmission Line to the Machine

Before opening the main electrical enclosure or attempting to repair or replace an electrical transmission line, lockout/tagout the machine properly. Follow your company's approved lockout/tagout procedures, which should include, but are not limited to, the steps here.


- 1. Engage an E-stop on the machine.
- 2. Turn the machine's disconnect switch to the Off position. This is usually required to open the main electrical enclosure's door.
- 3. Shut the power to the machine off at the machine's power source, which is usually an electrical service entry panel on the facility wall. One example of a locked-out power source panel is shown in Figure 1.
- 4. Attach a lock and tag that meet OSHA requirements for lockout/tagout to the electrical service entry panel.
- Open the door to the enclosure to which you need access. Using a multimeter, verify that the power is off.

Software Compatibility Requirement

The version number of the *MATCHPOINT BLADE* software must be 8.0.3 or higher in order for the *MPERIA* printer to function properly. If you are using software version 8.0.2 or earlier, please contact customer service at 1-800-523-3380 before proceeding with this hardware upgrade. The version number is displayed on the launch screen.



Disconnecting the V84i Controller

- 1. Verify your *MATCHPOINT BLADE* software is compatible with the *MPERIA* hardware. See Software Compatibility Requirement on pg. 5.
- 2. With the saw locked out, locate the V84i printer enclosure(s). Options A-D include one primary enclosure. Options E and F utilize an additional secondary enclosure.

3. In the V84i primary enclosure, disconnect the **Gripper** (top rearmost) and **LASM** (bottom rearmost) encoder cables. Before proceeding to next step, mark the connectors as Gripper and LASM (see Figure 3).

- 4. Use a flat-blade screwdriver to release and disconnect all print head cables connected to the primary and secondary V84i enclosures. The ports are labeled on the V84i controllers and the existing print head cables should be marked as Front A, Rear B, etc (see Figure 4).
 - The number and type of print head cables will vary according to the *BLADE* configuration. As you disconnect the cables, we recommend marking any print head cables that are not already labeled using the blank wire labels included in the install kit. Refer to Table 4 for wire names.

5. Disconnect the Serial/USB print head cable connected to the V84i Controller in the Primary Enclosure.

- 6. Use a compatible hex key to loosen the grommets through which the cables exit each enclosure. Remove the following disconnected cables from the V84i enclosures:
 - Gripper and LAM encoder cables
 - Print head cables (number may vary)
 - USB/Serial print cable
- 7. Disconnect the power and signal cable from the side of the V84i primary enclosure (see Figure 5).
- 8. Once all cables have been removed, remove any bolts securing the V84i enclosures in place and use a 2-man lift to move the old enclosures clear of the saw.

9. Using a 2 man-lift, position the new *MPERIA* enclosure in the former location of the primary V84i print enclosure to ensure the included cables can reach all necessary connection points.

Preparing the BLADE for MPERIA Upgrade

- 1. Before installation of any components can take place, the bundle of cables that runs through the infeed section of the *BLADE* must be released in order to allow the routing and connection of cables in later steps.
- 2. Use the thumbscrew to unlock and open the infeed access door and a compatible hex key to remove the infeed access panel.






3. Remove all visible cable ties and wrap behind both panels. The cables will be connected and re-bundled at a later point.

Installing the MPERIA Enclosure

- 1. Open the bottom door of the *BLADE* main electrical enclosure and locate the network switches labeled as PT_1, PT_2, and PT_3. See Figure 8.
 - Note that PT_2 and PT_3 switches may not be present in earlier *BLADE* configurations.

- 2. Follow the below steps to install the new 8-port network switch (referred to as PT NEW):
 - a) Attach PT_NEW to the DIN rail next to the existing switches.
 - b) To supply power, connect negative (0 VDC) terminal block on the green switch connector to terminal block 52-12 with a minimum 16 awg (white/blue) wire and connect positive (24 VDC) terminal block on the green switch connector to terminal block 50-8 with a minimum 16 awg (blue) wire.
 - c) Connect the green ground wire to the switch using the terminal ring 14-8 end and connect the other end to the nearest ground bar.
- 3. Review Table 5 to determine how to connect PT_NEW. The layout in the **My setup...** column should roughly match your *BLADE* configuration.

4. Connect the new 50-ft Cat5/6 cable to port 8 on PT New.

- 5. Route the **50-ft Cat5/6** cable from the network switch, across the saw, and to the *MPERIA* enclosure by carefully following these routing steps:
 - a) Disconnect the **USB cable for Moxa converter** that connects to the touch screen and feeds into the touch screen enclosure arm. See Figure 9.
 - b) From the main electrical enclosure, pull the **USB cable for Moxa converter** out through the touch screen enclosure arm. See Figure 9.

c) Locate the **50-ft Cat5/6 cable** in the bottom *BLADE* main electrical enclosure and route the free end into the top enclosure through the connecting hole. The cable will be fished through the conduit opening (circled in Figure 10).

d) In order to ease the process of fishing the **50-ft Cat5/6 cable** (i.e. connecting two cables together to pull one through an existing cable run), remove the connector end of the **USB cable for Moxa converter.** Then connect the bare end of the **USB cable for Moxa converter** to the **50-ft Cat5/6 cable** with electrical tape.

e) Fish (or pull) the **USB cable for Moxa converter** from where it
terminates at the V84i primary
enclosure to route the **50-ft Cat5/6 6 cable** through the conduit that
runs along the top of the saw
frame (see Figure 11). Note that
this conduit may not be installed
on earlier *BLADE* frames. In these
instances, route the cable **50-ft Cat5/6 cable** through the existing
path being used by the **USB cable for Moxa converter**.

During the routing/fishing process, exercise care not to damage the connector or the cable. If you encounter any resistance, remove the conduit clips and cable ties as necessary to aid movement.

f) Once the cable has been fished from the *BLADE* main electrical enclosure to the *MPERIA* enclosure, use the 3-1/2" cables ties to secure the **50-ft Cat5/6 cable** inside the cabinet as shown in Figure 12. The cable will be connected inside the *MPERIA* enclosure at a later step.

Figure 12: Cat5/6 Cable Management




- 6. Connect the 2 new encoder cables by following these steps:
 - a) Locate the old Gripper encoder cable (labeled as Gripper on page 6).
 - b) Disconnect the old Gripper cable at its connection point to the saw. See Figure 13.
 - Following the routing of the old Gripper cable through the infeed rail, connect the new Gripper cable to the saw.
 - d) Remove the old Gripper cable.
 - e) Locate the old LASM encoder cable (labeled as LASM on page 6).
 - f) Disconnect the old LASM cable at its connect point to the saw. See Figure 13.
 - g) At this point, one of two ways to connect the new LASM cable may be utilized. Use whichever methods suits the present *BLADE* configuration:

Method 1


Remove the old LASM cable. Use your hands to push the new LASM cable through the infeed cable channel and connect the new cable to the LASM port.

Method 2

Remove the green connector end of the old LASM cable (previously connected to the V84i enclosure) and use electrical tape to connect it to black screw-on connector on the new LASM cable. Pull on the loose end of the old



LASM cable to fish the new cable through the cable channel to the LASM port.




By default, the gripper encoder wiring is set up for a left-to-right board infeed configuration. If your *BLADE* saw is set up for a right to left board infeed configuration, you must rewire the gripper connector in order for the printer to function properly. See Appendix B on pg. 28 for further instructions.

7. Run all necessary cables through grommets on the bottom of the *MPERIA* enclosure as seen in Figure 15. Note that the included image may not match your configuration.



Your *BLADE* print configuration may not utilize every cable displayed below. See Appendix A to determine cable requirements for different print options A-F.

This is the recommended cable arrangement when entering the MPERIA enclosure to ensure your documentation matches your system.

If your printer system does not have all of these cables, leave some grommets blank.



Grommet Ports

8. Inside the *MPERIA* enclosure, connect the **50-ft Cat5/6** cable (that was run from the switch in the main enclosure) to the EXTERNAL NETWORK port on the print controller.

9. Connect all **print head cables** inside the *MPERIA* enclosure. The cables should be labeled with a letter (A or B) and their associated print head location (Front, Rear, or Edge). The V-Link PRINTHEAD ports are labeled A or B. See Figure 17.

Depending on the *BLADE* print configuration option A-F, one to three V-Links will be pre-installed by MiTek. For the purposes of this bulletin, the V-Links are labeled 1 > 2 > 3. See Appendix A on pg. 25 for drawings that demonstrate how to connect the **print head cables** in each configuration.

Figure 17: V-Link Arrangement and Labels






- 10. Depending on the frame number of the *BLADE saw*, one of two signal cable adapters will be required (see Figure 18).
 - Frames 1-41: Connect the **Gen 1 signal cable converter** (part #97118-501) to the signal cable (Figure 16).



NOTE: The Gen 1 cable also requires the installation of jumper wires in the bottom door of the *BLADE* main electrical enclosure. See Appendix C on pg. 29 for further instructions.

• Frames 42-289: Connect the **Gen 2 signal cable converter** (part #97117-501) to the signal cable (Figure 16).

- 11. Connect the power and signal cables (with *MPERIA* converter attached) to the bottom of the *MPERIA* enclosure.
- 12. Use wire ties to secure all cables running from the NEW enclosure to the saw.
- 13. Close / reattach all infeed door and panels.
- 14. Check that all routed cables are fully clear of moving items like the cat track, gripper, and waste conveyor.
- 15. Once the upgrade has been completed, use the supplied concrete anchors to anchor the *MPERIA* enclosure to the floor according to customer preference.
- 16. Make note on existing schematics that printer wiring has changed.

Configuring the BLADE Software

- 1. To complete the configuration of the *BLADE* software, you must copy the following files to a personal USB drive. If necessary, contact the customer service manager to determine the location of these files.
 - MPERIA Creator Software
 - Netconfig file
 - Emulator file (.LUA file)
- 2. Remove lockout/tagout devices.
- 3. Power on the saw and touch screen computer.
- 4. Check to see if *MPERIA* Creator or TightVNC is installed on the *BLADE* touch screen.
 - If neither are installed, use a USB drive to install *MPERIA* Creator.
- 5. Follow the below instructions to load the **netconfig** file onto the new *MPERIA* Controller:
 - a) Connect the USB drive to either USB port on the print controller located inside the *MPERIA* enclosure.
 - b) Disconnect the power cable from the controller, wait a few seconds, and then reconnect it. Upon loading, it will read the **netconfig** file and update the controller's IP Address to 192.168.1.25.

6. Launch the *MPERIA* software. Select anywhere when this screen appears to advance to the next screen.

- 7. Select at the top of the screen and enter the following info when asked:
 - a) IP address: 192.168.1.25
 - b) VNC port: 5900
 - c) Password: MPERIA
 - d) The host name should default to the IP Address (192.168.1.25).
- 8. Select Finish.
- 9. Select Connect.

10. The **emulator file (.LUA file)** is a plugin required to configure the V-Links with the latest software. Insert the thumb drive which contains the LUA file into the *MPERIA* controller.

11. Select the **Maintenance** tab and then select **Plugins**.

12. Select **Import** and choose the USB drive location connected to the *MPERIA* controller.

Figure 23: Unpopulated Plugins Window




13. Select **MiTek Emulator.lua** and select **OK**. Note that the below window will not be blank for your install.

14. Select **MiTek Emulator.lua** and select **Configure** to open the configuration window.

a) Check the **Enable** check-box.





Figure 26: Configuration Window

If more than 1 print head is on a single V-Link, you must also configure the sm[x] values as indicated in Figure 26. Up to 32 nozzles can be associated with each V-Link.

- 15. Click OK.
- 16. Click **Close** on the Plugin Window.
- 17. Configuration tab > Protocols button
 - a) Add V-Links (Ports: Front=20000, Rear=20001, or Edge=20002) and select emulator
- 18. Select the **Configuration** tab.
- 19. Select **Print Heads** to assign specific Print Heads to individual ports.
- 20. Select **Add** (+).

Figure 27: Protocols Window

21. Enter the port numbers.

- 22. Repeat the **Add** steps if there are multiple V-Links.
- 23. Once all ports are entered, select one port and set the protocol setting:
 - a) Protocol: Plugin
 - b) Plugin: Mitek Emulator.lua
 - c) Plugin Configuration: Name of printer (FRONT, REAR, or, EDGE). If there is only one V-Link, leave this field blank.
 - d) Repeat if there are multiple V-Links.
- 24. Close the Protocols window.
- 25. From the Configuration tab, select Print Heads.
- 26. Do the following steps for each print head to configure them. Select **Next** between each step.
 - a) Enter the installation name (FRONT, REAR, or EDGE).
 - b) Select V-series model.
 - c) Enter the installation name again (FRONT, REAR, or EDGE).
 - d) Select correct serial # for the V-Link, and click the arrow to send it to the right half of the screen.

Each V-Link can only manage UP TO 32 valves. If, for example, the saw has a 32_32_7 setup, 3 V-Links are required. If the saw has a 16_16 setup, the print heads can both be managed from 1 V-Link. On the next screen you will be required to choose which V-Link is being assigned to the FRONT Printer and configure it properly. If you are setting up a 16V for the FRONT, you will highlight the correct V-Link, select Configure, and change it to a 16_16.

- e) 8000 Maxi print head model
- f) Right-to-left
- g) Enter marker heights.

- h) Horiz spacing = .84 mm
- i) Set the print head orientation as seen Figure 29.

- j) Distance from trigger: Set to 10. After all firmware is updated, it will be changed to .1.
- k) Margin = 0
- 1) Do you want to add another marker? If there is only 1 print head per V-Link, select No. If there is more than 1 print head per V-Link, select Yes.
- m) No trigger
- n) Select Encoder button (only front V-Link has one).

o) Select the Front V-Link and then select Next.

- p) On the Basic tab, select:
 - Quadrature
 - Inverted
 - 15615
- q) On the Advanced tab, select:
 - Reverse filter limit at 2000

- r) Select Finish to return to the print heads window.
- 27. Download firmware for *MPERIA* software (.LBI file from Matthews MPERIA X.X.X-TOF+LowDistance).
- 28. Configure the details of the print heads:
 - a) Select an Installation name and on the Advanced tab (First FRONT on Figure 33):
 - Minimum Speed Threshold = 0
 - Check Enable Operator Trigger Button checkbox

- 29. Select a print head name (2nd FRONT in Figure 33):
 - a) On the Performance tab:
 - Dot size = 270, select Yes to ignore the warning
 - b) On the Advanced tab:
 - Ink Drop Flight Time = 2.1 ms
 - Check the Disable Overspeed Warning checkbox
- 30. Select the V-Link in Figure 33:
 - a) Distance from Trigger = .1
- 31. Click the New Installation button from the Print Heads screen in Figure 33.
- 32. Repeat previous steps for additional installations if present.
- 33. Cycle the power on the controller (waiting 10 seconds to reconnect) to ensure these settings are accepted.
- 34. Remove the USB drive from the print controller.

The below drawing depicts the gripper encoder wiring configuration that is required for a right to left or left to right (the default) board infeed configuration. Do not modify the wiring of the LASM encoder. Return to page 13.





Figure 38: Gripper Encoder Wiring Configurations

Appendix C

Follow the below steps to connect the jumper wires required for the 1st Gen *MPERIA* signal converter. See Figure 39 for an example installation.

- 1. Cut the 18 AWG wire into two equal lengths and strip both ends of the wires.
- 2. Locate terminal blocks IN29 AND IN30 in the bottom door of the *BLADE* main electrical enclosure.
- 3. Use a flat-blade screwdriver to connect a wire to the each of the bottom ports of terminal blocks IN29 AND IN30. After tightening the screws, gently pull on the wires to ensure they are secure.
- 4. Route the wires (outlined in red) behind the wiring duct and pull both wires through an opening near the set of 50 terminal blocks.
- 5. Connect the wires to any two free 50 terminal blocks. If two terminals blocks are not available, two cables may share a single port. After tightening the screws, gently pull on the wires to ensure they are secure.
- 6. Return to page 16.
